Oscar Herrero's career as concert guitarist and educator, supported by his outstanding achievements in both artistic fields, undoubtedly stands as one of the milestones of flamenco guitar in recent decades.

He has been honored with top recognitions and awards in the world of flamenco, such as the **National Flamenco Guitar Award** in Jerez de la Frontera, Cadiz, the **Bordón Minero** (Festival of La Unión), and the **International Cubadisco Award** in Havana, Cuba, among others.

Oscar Herrero is a musician whose early vocation was channeled not only into the concert realm but also into teaching; a field in which he can be considered a true pioneer and innovator. One of his most significant contributions has been the **Flamencómetro** Oscar Herrero, a new and valuable tool for the world of flamenco.

He has the unique privilege of being the first flamenco teacher to offer his courses in places like the **Tchaikovsky Conservatory** in Moscow and the **Chopin Academy** in Warsaw.

He has performed in the most prestigious venues and theaters around the world, from the Cairo Opera House to the Hermitage Theatre in Saint Petersburg, as well as in Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, China, the Philippines, the United States, Canada, Brazil, Jordan, Namibia, and throughout Europe and Latin America. On these stages, he has showcased musical creations ranging from solo guitar performances to flamenco concerts for guitar and orchestra.

His profound knowledge of flamenco music has also translated into a significant pedagogical production aimed at enthusiasts of all levels, as well as professionals. His work was recognized with the **Special Flamenco Didactics Award** at the International Festival of La Unión, Murcia, thus acknowledging a career that finds its greatest expression in the ever-growing catalog of his label and publishing house, "**Oscar Herrero Ediciones**."
